<b>SUBJECT</b>	Update on Outreach and Education Goals Status

This overview outlines the Committee's goals, the progress made so far, and future tasks.

### **Goal 1: Expand Live Event Outreach**

**Expand current outreach efforts by hosting live events for educators, supervisors, and associates to address common licensure pathway concerns and gather ongoing feedback.**

**Status:** In Progress

#### **Recent Activities:**

On November 12, 2025, staff hosted the first virtual listening session via Webex titled, BBS Lunch Time Listening Session: Artificial Intelligence in Mental Health Practice. The virtual listening session included a panel of four representatives from CAMFT, NASW-CA and California Alliance of Child and Family Services, with the goal of gathering their perspectives on the use of AI in mental health practice.

Each panelist addressed questions composed by staff on the benefits and risks of AI use in mental health practice, as well as ethical considerations practitioners, educators, students and trainees should be aware of when utilizing AI tools in the mental health field. The virtual listening session event drew over 450 viewers.

Viewers were requested to complete a post-webinar survey for staff to collect demographic information, and to gather the value, relevance, and overall satisfaction of the virtual listening session. The period for participants to respond to the survey closed on November 28, 2025, and approximately 118 responses were received. More detailed results of the post-webinar survey are included as **Attachment A**.

#### **Future Activities:**

- Plan and schedule future live events for educators, supervisors and associates focusing on the licensure pathway and legal requirements.
- Refine the live format to allow for public input and engagement.
- Identify additional interactive communication techniques and platforms to increase outreach engagement.

## **Goal 2: Establish Outreach Partnerships**

**Identify current outreach efforts or initiatives by other state, local and community agencies in reaching high school and undergraduates in underserved communities to increase the awareness and encourage entry into the mental health profession and determine how the Board can support those efforts.**

**Status:** In Progress

### **Recent Activities:**

In October 2025 board staff met with representatives from the California Board of Psychology and the California Board of Vocational Nursing to discuss potential collaborative outreach efforts and opportunities to enhance coordination with the Health Care Access and Information Agency (HCAI).

### **Future Activities:**

- Continue exploring collaborative outreach efforts
- Identify agencies and programs that support or focus on mental health practice.
- Update current and publish additional outreach materials regarding mental health professions.
- Develop and distribute short, accessible informational videos explaining the Board's role and licensure pathways to increase awareness of mental health professions and entry into the field.

## **Goal 3: Update Website and Outreach Materials**

**Update the Board's website and outreach materials to increase accessibility and expand on resources for licensees and individuals pursuing mental health careers.**

**Status:** In Progress

### **Recent Activity:**

- Continued review of existing website content.
- Collaborated with DCA's Office of Information Services (OIS) on proposed navigation changes and homepage enhancements.
- Provided OIS with desired structure and layout for the redesigned homepage. OIS will use this guidance to develop a mockup for BBS review and feedback.
- Restructured and created new content for the Enforcement section to improve clarity and provide detailed information on complaint processes, reporting discipline & criminal convictions, disciplinary actions, enforcement performance measures, and consumer protection. The new content will be easier to access and will incorporate exiting resources such as educational videos and informational pamphlets to enhance user understanding.
- Updated "Are you going to provide telehealth services in California?"
- Updating "FAQs for Supervisors"
- Updating "FAQs for Out-of-State Applicants"

**Future Activities:**

- Complete internal review of newly developed enforcement content for accuracy and clarity. Ensure integration of existing resources (video, pamphlets) into the updated section.
- Work with Board staff to update website content.
- Create and publish educational materials that highlight the importance of continued education in maternal and menopausal health for licensees.

**Goal 4: Strengthen Education Institution Outreach**

**Strengthen outreach to educational institutions and students to promote understanding of the licensure pathway and legal obligations of practitioners.**

**Status:** In Progress

**Recent Activities:**

Staff continue to conduct outreach presentations to schools and professional associations.

**Future Activities:**

- Expand targeted outreach to educational institutions.
- Incorporate common questions and issues identified in presentation into outreach materials.
- Create video presentations about the pathway to licensure and licensure laws that can be utilized by educators in a class setting.

**Goal 5: Increase Consumer Outreach**

**Develop strategies to reach the public and increase awareness of their rights as mental health consumers.**

**Status:** Not Started

**Future Activities:**

- Identify messaging priorities, communication platforms, and other potential routes for communicating information to consumers.
- Update the “Self-Empowerment: Choosing a Mental Health Professional in CA” publication.
- Create and distribute informational videos and publications concerning consumer rights and safety.

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## **Attachment A: Post Webinar Survey for BBS Lunch Time Listening Session: Artificial Intelligence in Mental Health Practice**

### **Background**

Viewers of the November 12, 2025, *BBS Lunch Time Listening Session: Artificial Intelligence in Mental Health Practice*, were requested to complete a post-webinar survey for staff to collect demographic information, and to gather the value, relevance, and overall satisfaction of the virtual listening session. The period for participants to respond to the survey closed on November 28, 2025, and approximately 118 responses were received out of 450 participants.

### **Notable Findings**

Notable findings of the survey results reveal the following:

- Approximately 39% of survey respondents found the webinar event to be *extremely valuable*, while about 35% of respondents found the webinar event to be *very valuable* (117 responses).
- Approximately 59% of survey respondents felt the topic of the event was *extremely relevant* to their specific work/interests, while approximately 34% of respondents felt the topic to be *very relevant* to their specific work/interests (118 responses).
- Survey respondents identified as the following (118 responses):
  - Licensee (i.e., LMFT, LCSW, LPCC, LEP) – 86%
  - Supervisor to pre-licensed individuals – 18%
  - Practitioner – 9%
  - Educator – 8%
  - Associate (i.e., AMFT, ASW, APCC) – 7%
  - Student – 6%

### **Public Comment Portion**

The November 12th virtual listening session included a portion for public comments. However, comments and questions from viewers were not addressed by panelists at the time of the event due to time constraints. The comments and feedback received from post-webinar survey respondents mostly expressed more time should be dedicated for public comments. In response to these comments raised by survey respondents, staff plans to gather questions from the public prior to future virtual listening session events via the following mediums:

- Social media: Currently the Board's Facebook page has over 36,000 followers and about 19,000 followers on the Board's Instagram page. Staff plans to promote future listening sessions on the Board's social media pages, encouraging followers to submit questions related to the listening session topic in the comments section of the social media post. Questions collected from the social media comments will be shared with panelists prior to the event.
- Webinar registration field: For the first virtual listening session, an email invitation with a link to register for the event was sent to individuals subscribed to the Board's general email subscriber list. Staff plans to continue utilizing the email subscriber list to advertise future board-hosted virtual/webinar events. Staff intends to include a comment field for attendees registering for board-hosted virtual/webinar events that will prompt attendees to submit their questions for panelists to address during the event. Prior to the event, questions collected via this method will be shared with event panelist for their response.

### **Additional Board-Hosted Live Events**

Many post-webinar survey respondents, about 98% of 116 responses, expressed they would like to see BBS host additional webinars. Staff plans to host another virtual listening session on the topic of AI to address questions raised during the public comment period of the first virtual listening session. Additionally, for the next virtual AI listening session staff will make efforts to include content based on feedback and comments from post-webinar survey respondents. Staff operations and resources will need to be taken into consideration before implementing certain content and topics for future virtual listening sessions.

How valuable did you find this webinar?



How relevant was the topic to your specific work/interests?





## SUGGESTIONS FOR FUTURE WEBINARS

1. Follow up on the topic of using AI is needed. How do we protect our clients as well as our licenses if the online platforms utilize AI for notes. Is there legislation regarding AI and mental health practice?
2. Based on the discussion of the panel, there are some essential considerations both for future meetings and potential questions to be answered during future panels.
  - Guidance for practitioners and the public, whether from professional organizations or the board itself, regarding recommendations for competent, safe, and appropriate use of AI.
  - Methods and framework for accountability based on AI use, both for individual practitioners' use of AI alongside harm of specific AI models and the responsibility of their respective companies.
  - Establishing a regulatory operative definition of "artificial intelligence".
  - Dividing the topics of future meetings to be able to capture the nuances of different aspects of artificial intelligence, including use of AI for the public, use of AI by practitioners, use of AI for training clinicians, and so on.
3. It may be beneficial for the future to allow the public to submit questions in advance and utilize the most common questions.
4. More on AI, Minor Consent and mandatory reporting.
5. BBS webinars are an EXCELLENT way to keep the lines of communication open and to provide important updates.
6. More information sharing. I feel like there were questions posed that needed to be answered. Maybe finding and inviting a cooperation who is mining this data and what their safeguards or goals are in relation to it. I would like future webinars regarding telehealth, BBS changes regarding supervision requirements for LMFT. More information on the social work compacts and some answers to the pros and cons of that compact.

Maybe it's better to talk about how to utilize them in healthier ways rather than worrying about its risks too much. No matter how much we worry about or set regulation around it, people who are going to abuse it are going to abuse it.
